Requirement for students admitted between September 2016 and August 2021 – A 3-module Faculty Compulsory Course on Research Methods, an elective Course on Primary Disciplines, and one of the followings:

- a Course on Primary Disciplines, or
- a course from the Faculty's Taught Master's Degree programmes, or
- two elective Courses on Research Methods (24 hours in total).

(Note: The 3-module Faculty Compulsory Course on Research Methods is renamed Foundation Course in Research Methods, and the Courses on Primary Disciplines are renamed Discipline-specific Courses with effect from September 2021.)

MPhil and 4-year PhD students registered in or after September 2021 are allowed to enrol for

- the Graduate School's 3-hour module on research methods (GRSC6104/6105/6106/6107) in addition to, but not in lieu of, the Faculty's compulsory 3-module foundation course in research methods comprising of EDUR6010, EDUR6020 and EDUR6011/EDUR6021;
- the Graduate School's 3-hour module on thesis writing (GRSC6120/6121/6140/6141) in addition to, but not in lieu of, the Faculty's compulsory course in research writing, i.e. EDUR7107.
